Seeding Healing Touch in VA VISN 12

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Overview

The VA Great Lakes Health Care System (VISN 12), a group of seven VA medical centers and over thirty VA clinics, is dedicated to providing a comprehensive health care package to America's veterans. VA Great Lakes serves veterans who reside in northwestern Indiana, northern Illinois, Wisconsin and the Upper Peninsula of Michigan.

Three medical centers in VISN 12 have been actively seeding Healing Touch (HT); Jesse Brown VA Medical Center, Edward Hines, Jr. VA Hospital and Clement J. Zablocki VA Medical Center. In early 2006 Lynne O'Donnell, Jesse Brown Medical Center, completed a Level 1 HT clas.s She left the class with the intention to bring HT into the VA.

Stan Rintelman completed HT Levels 1, 2, 3 and 4 in 2006. He completed Level 5 in 2012 and is currently working toward certification and a Healing Touch Practitioner. In addition Stan has completed Energy Anatomy, Level 1 and Advanced Practice 1 & 2.

In 2011 the first Healing Touch classes were taught at Hines VA Hospital and three Hines employees have completed Level 4 and are working on Level 5.

As of 2014 17 HT classes have been taught at Hines, 5 HT classes have been taught at Zablocki and 12 at Jesse Brown. Students who have taken these classes are activily offering Healing Touch to Veterans through pain clinics, fairs, Stand Downs and in a variety of other ways.

Healing Touch Center at JBVAMC to Date

- JBVAMC Patient Centered Care committee –supported the start of a HT Center at JB-VAMC. Space obtained, 10 tables purchased for the center and for future classes. Room furnished; and a display banner designed and purchased.
- HT Center opened November 2013. Now have a consult entitled: Energy Medicine/ Healing Touch/ Palliative Care. We have a progress note entitle: Healing Touch. Meets every Thursday, with time for scheduled consults for veterans and walk in times for veterans and em-
- HT is also being provided for JBVA In-patients by consults or thru the Palliative Care Consult team.
- JBVA- Community Based Outpatient Clinic called ABJ (Crown Point, Indiana) is being helped to set up their own HT Center and have HT Level 1 and 2 classes at their facility.

Jesse Brown Timeline

- Lynne O'Donnell attended a presentation about HT at the VA National Pain and Palliative Care Conference in Alexandrian, Virginia.
- A 90 minute Introduction to HT presentation by Ann O'Malley, RN, HTPC/I to about 75 JBVAMC clinical and clerical staff, volunteers and one veteran.

- Permission requested from Associate Chief of Patient Care Services to have a Level 1 HT class was granted - 19 VA clinical employees attended
- Ann O'Malley presented HT to Executive Leadership Board (ELB) and permission was granted to "roll out HT" to staff
- HT students provided HT during Nurses' Week, the Woman's Health Fair and 1st Education Fair - pre and post HT statistics were collected at some events
- Lynne O'Donnell began building a VA HT listserve
- Jennifer T, ANP, PhD candidate and instructor of nursing, consultant from the U of I, reviewed the literature and presented the Palliative Care Team with research that had been done on HT and Therapeutic Touch

- Provided HT at the second annual Stand Down in Algonquin
- Presented an hour long educational program on HT for the VA National Pain Teleconference - included HT folks from accross the nation
- Provided many mini HT sessions during Nurses Week
- Developed a simple intake collection tool to standardize the pre and post information that was needed before setting up research
- Coordinated the providing of HT sessions at the OEF/OIF Welcome Home Celebration for the new arrived home troops - new intake form was used

- Provided HT at the OEF/OIF Welcome Home celebration at University of Illinois
- Presented HT at the JBVAMC Pain Committee and asked that it be incorporated into a Complementary Corner of the Pain Clinic- was agreed upon but was later rescinded
- Associate Director of Patient Care Services allowed students to use HT with veterans and for more HT classes to be taught to nurses
- Presented an HT Introduction at the newly developed Pain Education School for those with chronic pain; classes developed by Psychology Service
- Hospital Pain Meeting- collaborating physician withdrew his collaboration at the meeting after equating HT to veterans getting placeboes - found new collaborating physicians to sign agreements
- Provided a HT session to the VA Deputy Chief of Nursing (Washington) during visit asked for her help in getting HT into the VA - Her Advice —"Take one VA at a time!"

• Seeding of VISN 12 VAs" began in earnest! Invited folks from the VISN 12 Pain committee or the Palliative Care Groups from each VA to come to a level 1 class at JBVAMC - attendees from Hines, Milwaukee, Lovell and the Madison clinic in Rockford came to classes

2011 - 2013

- Provided HT to about 200 veterans at the Valor Games at Soldier's Field, Chicago
- Helped set up a VA national phone call for VA parties interested in a joint proposal to bring HT into the VA. Worked closely with the Patient Centered Care Champion and Project Director- Dr. Leila Kozak to provide information & support in writing the grant proposal.
- Grant proposal, OPCC RFP 2013, awarded to bring education on massage and HT to 12 VISNs; and provide HT education to over 400 VA staff in about 20 VA facilities

Hines Timeline

2011

- 32 Hines employees are trained in Healing Touch
- Staff began documenting HT treatments in the patient medical record via a progress note with Healing Touch in the subject line

- 300 Mini HT sessions provided to Veterans and Employees at the Hines Health Fair
- 42 Hines employees are trained in Healing Touch

- Monies were awarded from the Office of Patient Center Care and Culture Transformation for support of HT training and equipment at Hines and 19 other VA's
- Pre and post surveys were completed by staff who took HT training under the monies from the grant
- Development began for an HT documentation template in CPRS with assistance of **Informatics**
- CPRS template options presented to staff for review and decision of most applicable template

- CPRS HT template was implemented
- HT Room established on the Acute Medicine/Telemetry Unit

To Date

- Three Hines employees have completed Level 4 and are working on Level 5.
- Staff from Hines trained in HT have volunteered at the Welcome Home event at Soldier Field and at the Alexian Brothers Cancer Center Clinic.
